LOOKING TO THE FUTURE OF KENBROOK BIBLE CAMP

Kenbrook Bible Camp is so blessed and grateful for God's abundant blessings. As we approach our 75th anniversary, we continue to be amazed by everything that God has accomplished and has in store for us. It is both humbling and an honor to serve the children, youth, and adults who visit Kenbrook every year. We are privileged to share the beautiful facilities and stunning natural surroundings that God has bestowed upon us in Lebanon County.

Through prayer, seeking the mind of God, taking time to sort through priorities and resources, we have created a list of much needed projects that will guide us into the next chapter of Kenbrook's history!

WOODLAND ADDITION & KITCHEN RENOVATION Anticipated Cost \$1,300,000

As part of our vision, we are focused on renovating and expanding Woodland Lodge – a building that has remained largely untouched since its opening in 1980. Our plan involves revamping all rooms, extending the lobby, renovate the kitchen and adding a deck to the back. Additionally, we aim to construct an additional gathering space that can accommodate up to 187 people. This will free up the current gathering space, allowing it to be used as a dining room once again.

GENERATORS Anticipated Cost \$54,000

The purchase of an emergency generator will allow Kenbrook to keep the essentials operational, such as lighting, hot water and refrigeration. From ensuring continuity of operations to protecting against losses and damage, an emergency generator will be a valuable asset for the camp.



NEW CREATION CENTER

Anticipated Cost \$740,000

The Youth Camp Lodge has been a beloved fixture on our campus for years, but unfortunately, it has been deemed unusable and beyond repair. To that end, we have decided to demolish the lodge and build a brand new Creation Center in its place. This facility will be used for educational purposes and will accommodate between 60 to 70 people.



NEW MAINTENANCE BUILDING

Anticipated Cost \$150,000

The maintenance building is currently the first building visible to visitors passing by the lake. Our plan is to move it behind Woodland Lodge. This move will ensure that essential items are still within reach while keeping them out of sight and not hindering the visitor's experience.





PAVILION ENCLOSURE Anticipated Cost \$116,000

Our pavilion is a popular spot, particularly during summer when it's bustling with day campers. It is also

used for all of our worship services. To make the most of this space during inclement weather, we're planning to enclose it on at least three sides. Depending on available funding, we hope to transform it into a yearround area suitable for all four seasons.

OTHER FEES & CONTINGENCY

Anticipated Cost \$790,000

To prepare for unexpected fees and events that may arise during a project, it is crucial to include contingency planning in our campaign budget. By setting aside extra funds, Kenbrook mitigate risks and keeps a cushion to keep our project on track.

NEW TABERNACLE Anticipated Cost \$350,000

Our vision is to construct an open-air tabernacle built into the hill beside the brook, just below Fairland Lodge. Although there is currently a maintenance building in this space, we envision the tabernacle as the first thing visitors will see upon entering the camp. It will provide space for summer camp worship, sessions and activities as well as space for retreats and other gatherings.
